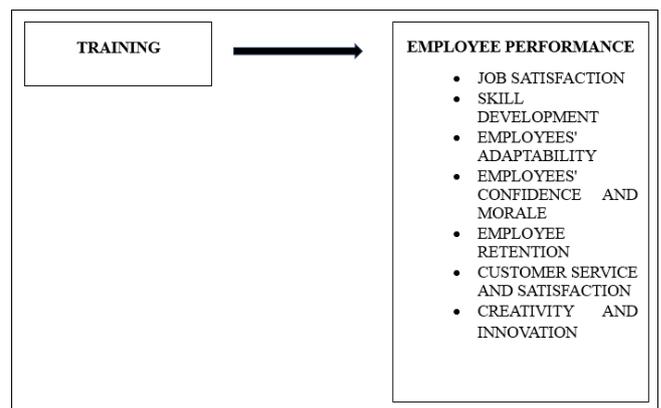


Fig 1: Conceptual framework
